Update on the Research of our Stunning Gum Tree... Menno

Kluiters writes... "I've received confirmation from Mike Wilcox that the Gum is indeed *Eucalyptus parvula*. A sample has been added to the herbarium of the Auckland Museum herbarium, the largest in NZ. This species is very rare in New Zealand and I think it's safe to say that the specimen at the church could be considered the largest in the country. The common name is Small-Leaved Gum and has a very small natural range in south-eastern New South Wales where it occurs at around 1000 meters above sea level. The official description is as follows: *This is a small bushy*



tree usually 20-30 feet in height with short crooked trunks to 15 inches in diameter. The common open growing trees are very bushy and the width of the heavily branched and dense crown is greater than the tree height. I measured your tree at 9.45m tall, with a spread of 12.6m and a trunk diameter of 1.01m at breast height. The measurements of the tree at Mangapapa Church are larger than the description so a large tree for this species indeed. Please let me know if anyone knows more about the tree. Also may I ask permission to add this tree to the NZ tree register, it's certainly worthy!" (Menno Kluiters – Arborist).
