<u>'Our Stunning Gum Tree'</u> - Dione received this fascinating email to the

Church Office this week - "Hi, I'm a local arborist. A passionate one. The Eucalyptus on the Atkinson St road side first came to my attention about half a year ago, merely by driving past. Its unusual foliage stood out, and I have visited it a number of times waiting for it to flower. Flowers are crucial for correct identification of gums, since there are so many different species. Recently I found a flower and took a sample and sent pictures to my friend Mike Wilcox, renowned botanist and Eucalypt expert. He got excited and believes it's a 'Eucalyptus Parvula', a very uncommon species in NZ indeed! He's asking for a few cuttings so it can be included in the herbarium at the Auckland



museum. Hereby I ask permission to do so? Also does anyone know anything regarding its history, who planted it?" **Menno Kluiters,** Dendrologic -Tree Consultants
